

"What young trainees have to understand is that, at least for those of us who love science, getting to do science is a prize in and of itself."

Kaelin and Semenza—and Sir Peter Ratcliffe, director for the Target Discovery Institute within the Nuffield Department of Medicine at Oxford University—were awarded the 2019 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for their discoveries of how cells sense and adapt to oxygen availability (*The Cancer Letter*, Oct 11, 20).
